1	Call to Order	Randy Crisp welcomed members and guests at 7 p.m. Randy also congratulated the local press for keeping the community informed.	
2	Guest Speakers	<p>France Gelin, provincial member for Nickel Belt stated that she represents our area at Queen's Park and programs and services available to people in our riding. She is able to assist with many issues such as birth certificates, family responsibility program, WSIB, travel grants, etc. Her office is available to do research to assist business or for special activities. She is also able to assist with completion of grants for projects, etc. should people wish answer to questions her office is able to find the answers although it is not always the answer they wish to hear.</p> <p>James Keenan and Ian Horne from FNX also spoke. James stated that underground operations would retire at the end of Sept. 2012 although some potential still remains and FNX will be investing about 2 million dollars this year into exploration. Hopefully all employees will be relocated. Randy thanked FNX for their previous donation and was informed that more would be forthcoming. CCAN members may be given a tour of the mine at some future time.</p> <p>Kris Longston, senior planner for the city of Greater Sudbury stated the Capreol had the best attendance at meetings held previously. Capreol has been granted the funding for the downtown area, but Kris has recommended waterfront rejuvenation as well. Council has approved a separate plan for the waterfront. The city must do a review of its official plan this year. This is a five year plan.</p> <p>Naomi Grant, chair of the coalition for a liveable Sudbury spoke about community revitalization – make a better place to live and improve the environment. She stated their group is available to assist outside areas if necessary.</p> <p>Joan Dumontelle, CO of cadets offered the services of the cadets to groups in Capreol wishing help with their projects. There are 30 cadets, 4 commissioned officer and 7 volunteers with this group. Next year marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the community. Joan's number is 858-3220 and would like the cadets to be more involved in the community. Ages of these people are 12 to 18.</p> <p>Cst. Chris Moggy is the new police representative for CCAN.</p>	



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		<p>He is part of the rural squad of five, who are dealing with persistant problems to lessen demand on uniform officers.
